

Date	Event
1086	Huyton appears in the Domesday Book as 'Hitune'
c1189	Grant of the church at Huyton by Robert de Lathom to the priory he founded at Burscough
1520	The Corpse Way, a footpath from Tarbock to Huyton in use as a route for burial parties to Huyton Parish Church
1670	Datestone on Huyton Hey Manor
1764	The Red Hazels built
1819	Original Huyton Cross erected, designed by Thomas Rickman

Date	Event
1830	Hurst House built. Huyton Gate railway station built; part of the Liverpool and Manchester Railway, the first passenger line in the world
1850	Huyton Tithe Map and Apportionment Schedule completed
1856	St. Agnes Roman Catholic Chapel built on land provided by the Molyneux-Seel family Huyton Congregational Church built on Huyton Hey Road
1860	Huyton Cricket and Bowling Club, Huyton Lane founded
1861	School built alongside Huyton Congregational Church, Huyton Hey Road
1872	Discovery of a Norman font found buried under the tower of St Michael's Church

Date	Event
1873	St. Gabriel's school built in Huyton Quarry, also used as a temporary church
1877	Huyton Local Government Board established
1890	New Congregational Church built at the junction of Victoria Road and Seel Road
	Former Congregational Church in Huyton Hey Road becomes known as Park Hall
1894	Huyton Urban District Council, covering Huyton, Roby and Thingwall formed
	Liverpool College for Girls, Huyton (later renamed Huyton College) opens St. Gabriel's Church, Huyton Quarry consecrated
1897	New Huyton Cross erected, replacing the original to celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond
	Jubilee
1905	Royal visit by King Edward VII

Date	Event
1921	Huyton-with-Roby's war memorial to the Great War dead erected in the grounds of the council offices, Derby Road'
1940	Internment camp established on newly built housing estate at Page Moss
1943	Prisoner of war camp established on King George V Playing Fields
1940's	First of Huyton's new wartime housing estates under construction
1948	Huyton-with-Roby's Royal Air Force Association Branch formed (R.A.F.A)
1961	Huntley and Palmer's biscuit factory opens on Wilson Road, Huyton Industrial Estate

Dates	Event
1964	Huyton M.P. Harold Wilson officially opens the R.A.F.A. branch headquarters located in the former villa 'Fairfield,' Archway Road – July 1964
1966	Saint Joseph's RC Primary School Opened
1967	Huyton-with-Roby Royal British Legion Club opens in 'Heathbank,' Archway
1968	Huyton Rugby League Football Club formed. From 1969 they played at the new Alt Park ground, off Liverpool Road
1971	Huyton Boys won the English Schools F.A. Cup
